The Undergraduate Certificate Program in Intergroup Dialogue consists of **12 credit hours** of course work, spanning 4 categories of courses:

- **General Education (3 credit hours):** The course is dialogue-intensive and incorporates the four-stage IGD Model.
- **Leadership and Communication (3 credit hours):** The course is designed to train you to facilitate dialogues for other students.
- **Social Identity and Diversity (3 credit hours):** The course provides additional context in social identity and diversity issues relevant to your chosen field.
- **Capstone (3 credit hours):** The course is a 400-level course that guides you to facilitate dialogues in subsequent general education “dialogue-intensive” courses for your peers.

IGD Certificate Prerequisite Checklist
